

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 49: 3, 5-6

This reading is a short passage from the second song of the Servant of the Lord. The Lord will show his glory through His servant whose mission is to restore Israel and bring salvation "to the ends of the earth."

Responsorial Psalm: Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1: 1-3

Paul sends greetings to the people of Corinth, who have been called to be holy and consecrated in Christ.

Gospel: John 1: 29-34

When Jesus visits John, John recognizes Jesus as the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." John further indicates that Jesus is truly the Messiah and "God's chosen One."

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time January 18, 2026

"John testified further saying, 'I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever, you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.' Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God.'"

As happened last week, we are still at the Jordan, observing the sign of the presence of the Spirit. Isn't it a powerful moment when John the Evangelist in his first chapter quotes the Baptist saying, "He is the Son of God?" The Baptist said he did not know Him. This is what we believe! How well do we know Jesus, not just about Jesus. Do I know Him as well as He knows me? Open the Bible, read the word, join a discussion group. Jesus and His Spirit will join you.
